First Omer count at seder; after this count omer every night after dark.

1:00 AM - "midnight" afikoman should be eaten by then

8:38 PM Havdalah - Yom Tov ends and Hol HaMoed begins

5:45 PM services - 7:37 PM Candle Lighting

8:45 PM Festival ends. Havdalah is recited at home, with wine and final brakhah, no spices or candle

**9:30 PM** Hametz may again be eaten.
